What We Do

Each of the six color blocks of the First Steps logo represents a core area of service, outlining our comprehensive strategy to prepare children for long-term school success.

With measurable outcomes across each of its six school readiness strategy areas, First Steps is getting results.



Healthy Start

We begin with a focus on providing a healthy start to life. This includes prenatal and post-partum services for both mother and baby. In 2007, First Steps collaborated with key philanthropic and agency partners to bring Nurse-Family Partnership to SC having a significant impact on reducing premature births and Medicaid costs.



Quality Childcare

Quality childcare starts with quality childcare providers. Our quality enhancement and training strategies lead to improved teacher-student interaction, which research shows has a significant impact on a child's development and success in school.



Family Strengthening

Our home visitation strategies, such as Parents as Teachers, Parent-Child Home and Early Steps to School Success, are helping parents understand their responsibilities to care for and be positive models for their children. As a result of First Steps' intervention and parenting support, 66% of clients initially assessed at "low" levels of parenting have achieved moderate or high levels of parenting skill.



Early Education

Private-public partnerships through First Steps 4K have led to significant cost efficiencies in the delivery of publicly funded 4K. One recent analysis suggests First Steps is achieving comparable results, without the need for costly capital construction, for 80 cents on the dollar.



Early Intervention

According to recent federal evaluations, outcomes for clients participating in BabyNet early intervention programs are above national averages. BabyNet matches the special needs of infants and toddlers who have disabilities and/or developmental delays with customized, community-based resources.




School Transition

I meet the ladies from Allendale County First Steps at community event, the "Back to School Bash". They were registering children for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library and talking about First Steps and the

programs they offered. All I could say was, "this where I need to be".

Earlier that week, I went to DSS to apply for child care. I was told I didn't qualify and to check with First Steps. Maybe I'd qualify for their program. I didn't go. While visiting the vendors at the "Back to School Bash", I came to First Steps table and remembered DSS mentioned them to me.

I registered my daughter for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library and scheduled an appointment for that next week. This appointment I kept., and I'm so glad I did. I now have a library at home because I enrolled into the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. I also enrolled into First Steps parenting program, where I receive additional books at my home visit and group meetings. I was also eligible for a child care voucher, which I was in desperate need of.

With First Steps help, my parenting skills have improved. They showed me how to work with my child at home, getting her ready for kindergarten. Because of First Steps I'm my child's first teacher. I look forward to my home visits and group meeting every month. Also, my daughter loves going to the post office to get books.

Parents as Teachers



Parents play a critical role in their child's development.

Program Description

The Parents as Teachers (PAT) model is an evidence-based early childhood home visiting framework for families with children prenatal through kindergarten entry that builds strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to learn. PAT services include:

- 1. **Personal Visits** minimum twice monthly in the client's home
- 2. **Group Connections** with other PAT families at least monthly
- 3. Screenings and Assessments to identify issues early
- Resource and Referral Network connecting families to needed resources

Our PAT program:

- Increases parent knowledge of child development and improves parenting practices
- Provides early detection of developmental delays and health issues
- ✓ Prevents child abuse and neglect
- ✓ Increases children's school readiness and school success

Allendale First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our PAT families:

90% ... live in poverty

20% ... didn't graduate high school

10% ... were teen parents

- ✓ Averaged two (2) home visits per family
- ✓ Identified and addressed four (4) potential developmental delays
- ✓ Improved parenting practices as evidence by a positive growth of 0.09 in KIPS and 0.42 in ACIRI
- ✓ Improved literacy skills by distributing 1903 books (1056 DPIL) books to families, building libraries in homes
- Made fourteen (21) connections for families to services such Department of Social Service, Scholarships, Housing Authority, and Adult Education GED program

Public Awareness. Throughout the summer, First Steps releases tips to media to help parents and caregivers get children ready for kindergarten.

Partner school districts place as many CTK children as possible in their home visitor's classroom for kindergarten, thereby building upon the teacher-child and parent-teacher relationships built over the summer.

This year, our Countdown to Kindergarten program:

- Increased the amount of time parents spent reading to children by 90%
- According to kindergarten teachers, 70% of CTK children performed as well as, or better than, their fellow students in academics (reading and math)
- According to kindergarten teachers, 80% of CTK parents were more involved than other parents in their child's education in the areas of home activities relating to literacy and more involved with the teachers.

Program Description

Efforts to improve the quality of child care must include providing affordable, high quality training that meets the needs of the local child care workforce.

First Steps-sponsored training is certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and includes topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Best practices in training include not only the training, but also follow-up with supported practice in the classroom.

Child Care Scholarships

Too many families in Allendale County cannot afford quality care for their children.

Program Description

Access to quality child care is essential for children to experience safe, nurturing, and stimulating interactions while away from their primary caregivers. Yet, of those families working or going to school who are income-eligible for child care assistance in South Carolina, only a small fraction receive it due to lack of funds. In the absence of nurturing and consistently available family, friends or neighbors, parents are faced with few - or no – affordable care options.

Allendale First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our scholarship families:

100% ... live in poverty

36% ... didn't graduate high school

18% ... were teen parents


36% ... had developmental delays

In addition to regular monitoring of child care providers that receive First Steps scholarships, First Steps conducts at least one developmental screening each year with scholarship children and connects families to needed services within the community.

Scholarship recipients also participate in the Parent as Teachers (PAT) program.

Allendale County First Steps Board of Directors and their community partners sponsored a "Secret Santa Angel Tree" which provided Christmas gifts for twenty-one (21) children participating in our Parents as Teachers program and (8) other needy families. These twenty-nine (29) families were blessed with a happy holiday because of our collaboration with our partners.

Our partnership with Allendale County School District twenty (20) children were able to participate in our summer program, Countdown to Kindergarten. These children completed all six visits, which better prepared them to enter into kindergarten. They also received a back pack loaded with school supplies and attended the EdVenture Children's Museum Annual Countdown to Kindergarten Celebration in Columbia.

At the "Back to School Expo", Allendale County First Steps Board of Directors provided back packs and school supplies to Pre-K students attending Little New Steps Child care Center, Allendale-Fairfax Elementary School, and OCAB. At the Expo, along with Palmetto Project, we registered children 0-4 years old for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library(DPIL).

- **(4)provide services** so all children receive the protection, nutrition, and health care needed to thrive in the early years of life so they arrive at school ready to succeed; and
- **(5)mobilize communities** to focus efforts on providing enhanced services to support families and their young children so as to enable every child to reach school healthy and ready to succeed.
