Facilitators at the Summer Wellness Camp were Pauletta Plowden, First Steps Executive Director, Erica Smith, First Steps Program Manager, and Linda Mintz, First Steps Parent Educator. for mothers and their children: Health Assessments/Blood Pressure/BMI, Making Your Health a Priority, Talking to your Medical Provider, Healthy Ways of Eating & Living, Motivating Kids to be Healthy & Active, Seven Ways to beat Stress Fat, Fitness, Nutrition and Keeping the Weight Off.

A total of twelve moms and five children participated in this important health and wellness program with an average weight loss of six pounds. This project was supported by Bamberg School District One and funded through grants from the Greater Savannah River Community Foundation and the Bamberg County Council Recreation Fund. Participants who completed the four week course received a rich resource bag that included a "MOMMYCISE Love Yourself, Be Inspired" tee shirt and water cup, a workout DVD tape and wellness curriculum.
