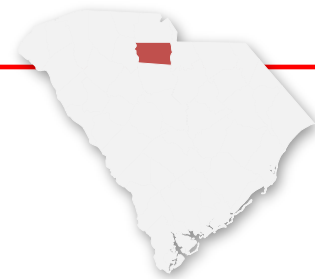

The lingering effect of community engagement that benefits our youngest learners become evident. We see communities that are sensitive to family issues for advancing all facets of school readiness. Empowered stakeholders seek opportunities to collaborate to spread the messages of why it is imperative to invest in early childhood programming and services. Creating networks within and beyond county borders enable parents, community leaders, and organizations to combine resources that fortify the local infrastructure for supporting school readiness. Research repeatedly tells us the window of opportunity for capitalizing on brain growth and development is before age four. Focusing on children zero to age three by imbedding quality care practices in the home and at child care services will positively impact brain development. The pathway to learning success encompasses child rearing practices in the home. The Parents As Teachers program grooms parents to be their child's most fervent advocate. This is the ground floor where learning begins. Guidance and support are provided to families during the earliest period of child rearing. Moreover, increasing the skills and knowledge of teachers in early care classrooms is critical. The need for quality child care for teen mothers and working parents is the catalyst for channeling agency resources for increasing early care classroom best practices. The County Partnership Board believes each child starting school healthy and ready to succeed requires investing in our youngest learners now.

Each of the six color blocks of the First Steps logo represents a core area of service, outlining our comprehensive strategy to prepare children for long-term school success.

With **measurable outcomes across each of its six school readiness strategy areas**, First Steps is getting results.



Healthy Start

We begin with a focus on providing a healthy start to life. This includes prenatal and post-partum services for both mother and baby. In 2007, First Steps collaborated with key philanthropic and agency partners to bring Nurse-Family Partnership to SC having a significant impact on reducing premature births and Medicaid costs.



Quality Childcare

Quality childcare starts with quality childcare providers. Our quality enhancement and training strategies lead to improved teacher-student interaction, which research shows has a significant impact on a child's development and success in school.



Family Strengthening

Our home visitation strategies, such as Parents as Teachers, Parent-Child Home and Early Steps to School Success, are helping parents understand their responsibilities to care for and be positive models for their children. As a result of First Steps' intervention and parenting support, 66% of clients initially assessed at "low" levels of parenting have achieved moderate or high levels of parenting skill.



Early Education

Private-public partnerships through First Steps 4K have led to significant cost efficiencies in the delivery of publicly funded 4K. One recent analysis suggests First Steps is achieving comparable results, without the need for costly capital construction, for 80 cents on the dollar.



Early Intervention

According to recent federal evaluations, outcomes for clients participating in BabyNet early intervention programs are above national averages. BabyNet matches the special needs of infants and toddlers who have disabilities and/or developmental delays with customized, community-based resources.



School Transition

Each of the corresponding blocks of services leads ultimately to the goal of transitioning children successfully to school. Programs like Countdown to Kindergarten and From Day One to Grade One are ultimately preparing children for school success.

Based on the needs of our community, Chester County First Steps focuses its investments in Parents As Teachers Program and Child Care Trainings.



Parents play a critical role in their child's development.

Program Description

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is an evidence-based home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:

1. **Personal Visits** at least twice monthly
2. **Monthly Group Connections** with other PAT families
3. **Screenings and Assessments** to identify developmental concerns
4. **Connections to Outside Resources** that families may need to succeed

Chester County First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our PAT families:

- 93% ... live in poverty
- 5% ... didn't graduate from high school
- 81% ... were teen parents

This year, our Parents as Teachers program:

- ✓ Averaged 25.26 home visits per family
- ✓ Identified and addressed 8 potential developmental delays
- ✓ Improved parenting practices an average of .17 within a six-month period from pre-to-post scores
- ✓ Improved literacy skills an average of .22 for parents and .21 for children within a six-month period from pre-to-post scores

Program Description

High-quality child care hinges on high-quality professional development that meets the needs of the local child care workforce.

First Steps-sponsored training is certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and includes topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Best practices in training include not only the training itself, but follow-up in the classroom.

This year, our Training program provided:

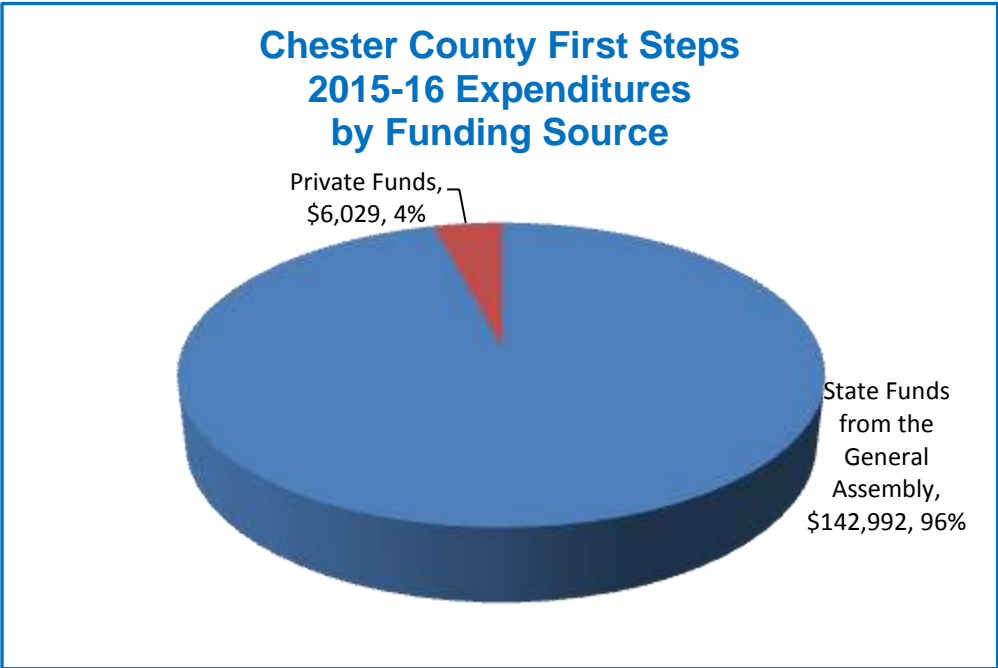
- ✓ 80 early childhood staff with high quality training

Parents As Teachers Program

Tiffany McClurkin was a senior in high school when she became pregnant with her first child. She enrolled in the Chester County First Steps Parents As Teachers Program on the suggestion of her older sister who was already a participant. Tiffany was encouraged to continue her education and received support from her parent educator. She learned to set realistic goals for herself and her daughter, Kelsey. She also learned what to expect from her pregnancy as well as her Kelsey's growth & development. She was excited to learn what her child should be doing and how she could provide activities to promote those skills.

After graduating from high school, Tiffany attended the Chester campus of York Technical College to pursue a Nursing degree. Midway through the program, she became pregnant with a second child. She felt she should give up on her goal of becoming a nurse and focus solely on her children. Her parent educator encouraged her to continue taking classes at York Tech on a part time basis and as much online as possible.

Tiffany is now a semester away from completing the nursing program, assistant manager at Dollar Tree and living in her own apartment with her two children. She realizes she can accomplish her major goals by setting small attainable goals directed toward the greater ones. She is determined to be a college graduate so she can be independent and instill those qualities in her children. She attributes her success to have a great support system composed of her family along with Chester County First Steps.

- (4) provide services** so all children receive the protection, nutrition, and health care needed to thrive in the early years of life so they arrive at school ready to succeed; and
- (5) mobilize communities** to focus efforts on providing enhanced services to support families and their young children so as to enable every child to reach school healthy and ready to succeed.
