

- ➤ Two-generation programs share 3


TWO GENERATION APPROACH

There are five key components of the two- generation approach: education and


workforce

- 1. Identified and recruited stakeholders
- 2. Hired consultant to develop strategic plan
- 3. Hired project coordinator
- 4. Held a community engagement event
- 5. Implementation of existing community resources into Nicholtown (Ex: GHS Mobile Clinic)
- 6. Visited similar projects within and beyond Greenville
- 7. Analysis of current progress and next steps



STAKEHOLDERS

- Each person comes to the project with her own agenda.
- Relationships with stakeholders must be fostered, and it is essential to keep them engaged in the project's progress.
- It is fundamentally important to assess current stakeholders in the NCFC project when considering a new aspect of work that must be done to further the NCFC goals.


